Immunization Requirements by Birth Year:

Born in USA	
1900-1956	TD/TDAP (within the last 10 years)
1957-1979	MMR (2 doses) TDAP/TD
1980-1999 (19 years or older)	MMR (2 doses) TDAP/TD Varicella (2 doses or proof of history of chicken pox disease)
2000 or later (18 years or younger)	Hepatitis B (3 doses) MMR (2 doses) TDAP/TD Varicella (2 doses or proof of history of chicken pox disease)

International Students	
1900-1956	MMR (2 doses) TDAP/TD
1957-1979	MMR (2 doses) TDAP/TD Varicella (2 doses or proof of history of chicken pox disease)
1980-1999 (19 years or older)	MMR (2 doses) TDAP/TD Varicella (2 doses or proof of history of chicken pox disease)
2000 or later (18 years or younger)	Hepatitis B (3 doses) MMR (2 doses) TDAP/TD Varicella (2 doses or proof of history of chicken pox disease)

GSU Student Health Clinic Prices for Immunizations:

MMR - \$74.00 per/dose

TDAP - \$57.00

TD Booster - \$30.00

Varicella - \$125.00 per/dose

Hepatitis B - \$75.00 per/dose

MMR Titer - \$64.00

Varicella Titer - \$22.00

Hepatitis B Titer - \$ 18.00

(There is not Titer for TDAP/TD)

Exemptions:

Military Students

Students who are no longer active in the military can submit a copy of their DD214 as verification for immunization.

Distance Learning Students

Students who are only in enrolled in online classes can submit verification for exemption for distance learning by using the immunization certification form and by selecting the Distance Learning Only option and submitting the form. You will have to verify for every semester you are taking classes online.

Religious Exemption

Students who are objecting to get immunizations for religious reasons must submit an Affidavit of Religious Objection to Immunization form and must be signed and stamped by a Notary Public.

Temporary or Permanent Medical Waivers

Students who are unable to get immunizations for medical reasons must submit a certified physicians letter stating that the student is unable to receive immunizations due to listed condition(s). The statement must be on a official letterhead and signed by a physician.
