Faculty Mentoring is a professional development program designed to engage scholars from around the world in customized, field-specific, and cross-cultural activities. Visiting scholars are paired with Georgia State University faculty to engage in academic mentoring including: research, class observations, syllabi development and enhancement course evaluation, and language training.

Beyond the classroom, participants take part in cross-cultural experiences, such as sporting and cultural events, visits to historical sites, and travel within Georgia and sometimes across the US. Scholars enhance their written and oral English language proficiency through the Intensive Language Program and individual or group tutoring sessions.

## MENTEE PROFILE

- Applicants should hold a master's or doctorate degree. Post-doc and PhD students are welcome.
- Interested in learning about the U.S. educational system while collaborating on research and projects with Georgia State University faculty.
- Meet J-I visa requirements, including English language proficiency and proof of financial support.

## PROGRAM COORDINATION & SERVICES

- Coordination of admission and J-I visa application (English language proficiency interviews, invitation letters, International Student and Scholar Services application and fees, etc.).
- Logistical support for airport pick-up and drop-off.
- Invitations to orientation and farewell events.
- Assistance in developing program goals, roles, and responsibilities.
- Recorded program sessions and presentation.
- Access to university resources and services including the Recreation Center, Library, The Center for Excellence in Teaching, Learning & Online Education, The Center for International Resources & Collaborative Language Engagement, and the Writing Studio.
- Trips to attractions including The Coca-Cola Museum, CNN, and the Georgia Aquarium.

**Please Note:** Airfare, visa fees, and mandatory medical insurance are not included. Housing may be included based on track selection.
