Diana Coetzee teaches Legal English to international LL.M. students at Georgia State University's College of Law. As a Legal English instructor, Professor Coetzee is responsible for designing and implementing a corpus-based curriculum that prepares foreign-trained lawyers to sit for the Georgia-Bar exam. Additionally, Professor Coetzee teaches English for Academic Purposes at Brenau University's Intensive English Program, ON Language. Previously, she taught English as a Second

Language in Thailand, Turkey, and Slovakia. In addition to teaching English, Professor Coetzee taught Social Problems and spearheaded the implementation of a campus-wide, interdisciplinary service-learning program at Tillamook Bay Community College in Oregon. Professor Coetzee holds an M.A. in Applied Linguistics from Georgia State University, a B.A. in Interdisciplinary Studies, and a minor in Italian from Florida Atlantic University. Professor Coetzee's academic interests are focused on research topics related to Corpus Linguistics, Legal English, and Academic English.
