Liam Madden, Associate Professor of English, has taught at Georgia State University Perimeter College since 2004. He earned his M.A. in English from Virginia Commonwealth University (1993) and studied the Thai language in Bangkok, Thailand (1990-92), Mandarin Chinese at Nankai University, Tianjin P.R.C (1995) and Japanese at UC Berkeley (1996-97). Liam continued his graduate studies and research in Mandarin Chinese language and Asian literature in the University of Georgia Comparative Literature Dept. (1994-2000).

He was awarded fellowships to the East-West Center/Asian Studies Development Program of the University Hawaii in 2005 & 2010 and received GSU Perimeter College's Faculty Globalization Award in 2017.

Liam served as a faculty co-leader on the USG Asia Council's China Study Abroad Program in 2018 and as its on-site Coordinator in 2019. Liam's recent popular courses include Literature of early China and Eurasian Civilizations Connected by the Silk Road, Survey of Asian-American Literature, and an English 1102 course focused on reading contemporary short stories written by multicultural authors of modern China. Liam has ties to Atlanta's Burmese community, going back to his days as an International Service Corps volunteer in Thailand, and he assisted Burmese to settle in Georgia in 1992, 2000, and 2010. Liam enjoys serving as the advisor for GSU's Dunwoody Campus China Club.
